


CASA Funding Sources and Annual Comparison

NEW JERSEY


In FY14, CASA programs (at both the local and state levels) received funding from a variety of sources, totaling \$6,625,666. The New Jersey State Budget Appropriation of \$1,150,000 contributed just over 17% to that total.

Federal funding passed through the Court Improvement Project, Victims of Crime Act Victim Assistance Grants, National CASA Association, and Community Development and Community Services Block Grants accounted for 21% of that total. The remaining 61% was raised by CASA programs from private sources, through grant-writing, solicitations and donor drives, corporate sponsorships, and fundraising events.



Significantly, state funding provides a match for federal and foundation grants. In fact, in two different instances, CASA assisted the State in drawing down Federal Funding that otherwise would not have come to New Jersey.

The following chart provides a comparison of CASA's funding sources from FY08 through FY14.
